






Alumni Spotlight — Nyoman's Story

Financial education changed Nyoman's life. Now, she's changing others'.





Discovering Enrich after 10 years of working in HK She graduated from our programmes in 2017

Nyoman came to Hong Kong from Indonesia with big dreams and even bigger responsibilities. For ten years, she worked as a domestic worker, determined to build a better future. Then she found Enrich.

At her first workshop, Nyoman discovered a safe space to talk about money with openness and vulnerability. She kept joining one workshop after another until she graduated. She went on to become an Enrich Ambassador where she led outreach efforts, spoke at the Indonesian Consulate, and inspired new arrivals with her story.



Now a Business Owner

Leveraging the knowledge and tools she got at Enrich, she now runs a catering supply to 21 shops and a bakery.

Her dream evolved: from working in a company to building her own. In 2018, Nyoman returned to Indonesia — confident and equipped. Today, she runs a thriving food business: a fried rice stall and makes spring roll chips that are distributed to 21 shops and a bakery,

Visibility, Voice, and Inclusion

A children's book celebrating migrant domestic workers through art and storytelling—told from a child's perspective.

Family Fun Day and Book Launch, 11 May 2024 – A heartwarming event inspired by the children's book *My Extra-Special Aunty*, authored by Joanna Bowers, illustrated by Cristina Cayat and Noemi Manguera from the migrant artists collective, Guhit Kulay International.

Hosted by Asia Society Hong Kong, the event featured animated book readings and creative activities for children and their "aunties." The book is Hong Kong's first children's book showcasing artistic talent from migrant domestic workers.

Families were encouraged to attend with their domestic workers to foster empathy, kindness, and mutual respect. All book sale proceeds were donated to Enrich and Pathfinders, supporting migrant worker empowerment.

The event promoted inclusive storytelling, cultural appreciation, and stronger family-worker relationships.



This joint initiative with Pathfinders, bridged generations and cultures, inviting children to see their caregivers not just as helpers, but as artists and mentors.

Before Enrich, Sofia was financially lost. She had several bank loans in the Philippines and in Hong Kong.

Through Enrich workshops, she managed to take control of her finances, follow through with a plan to prioritise her financial obligations. With self-discipline and patience, she settled all her loans in one year.

Sofia then started building her emergency fund and long-term goals for her family and future business. Her journey reflects the transformative power of financial education to those who often face systemic barriers to economic independence.


